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Trusted, Neutral Local Number Portability Administrator Applauds Initiation of the NPAC

Procurement Process

As the LNPA, Neustar runs the Number Portability Administration Center (NPAC), the national

telephone number registry service that enables the routing of calls to ported numbers. Neustar

assisted the communications industry in implementing wireline number portability in 1997,

wireless number portability in 2003, and Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) number portability

in 2007.
